London: Meetings at the Club House

Both General and Informal meetings start at 7.30pm sharp, with the bar opening from 6pm. On street parking is legally available after 6.30pm in Charlotte Road. The Library remains open until 7pm.

May 9 **Julian Freeman-Attwood The mountains of the Antarctic Peninsular**

The talk covers three sailing / mountaineering expeditions on the 55ft Sailing vessel 'Pelagic', built and owned by the 4 times round the world Captain James 'Skip' Novak.

Each trip set off from Ushuaia near Cape Horn battling almost always through big seas across the 600 miles wide Drake passage to the South Shetlands. A further 300 miles south, the expeditions concentrated on the mountains of the Graham Land coast of continental Antarctica.

The talk covers mountains climbed, most notably Mt Williams on Anvers Island, attempts on Cape Renard Tower and Mt Italia on Wiencke Island.

Various aspects of relevant Antarctic history are included plus visits to two scientific bases and a glimpse of the wildlife seen.

INFORMAL MEETINGS

These meetings provide a good opportunity for members to meet one another, and exchange news, views and information. New members and prospective members are particularly welcome. Such meetings are normally held on the fourth Tuesday of the month. The bar opens at 6 pm, lecture starts at 7.30 pm. The library is usually staffed by volunteers between 5 and 7 pm.

April 18 **Bear Grylls "Facing Up - the youngest Briton to climb Everest"**

A remarkable journey to the summit of Everest, a vivid description of the trials and tribulations of life high up, also described in his book 'Facing Up'.

May 23 Henry Day “Annapurna 1- 30 years on (and three days)”

In the year that marks the 50th anniversary of the first ascent by the French and the 30th of the second and third by British teams, this account of the Army expedition uses slides dusted off for the first time in many years. The narrator plans to include unreliable memories of a meeting called by Dougal Haston and Don Whillans to pool anoxic memories of the view from the top. (Sir Christian’s account is to follow in December at the AGM)

ALPINE MEETS 2000 8 July - 12 August

The following joint ABMSAC/AC/CC Meets have been arranged:

The Bregaglia Circuit 8 - 15 July 2000

This will be a mountain walking tour of the Val Bregaglia, a valley renowned for its Italianate villages, Mediterranean vegetation and spectacular rock peaks. From Maloja the northern wall of the Bregaglia is traversed to the picturesque village of Soglio, then a descent to the valley floor is followed by an ascent into the beautiful Val Bondasca and an exhilarating high level traverse over passes and glaciers before descending to the Forno valley to Maloja.

Accommodation for the first three nights will probably be in a pension in Vicosporano and thereafter in SAC huts Sasc Fura, Albigna and Forno. Local transport and baggage storage facilities will be arranged, for which there will be a modest charge. Please note that spare clothing, washing gear and hill food will need to be carried up to and between huts. The huts provide half-board terms.

Pontresina 15 - 29 July (Hotel-based participants), 15 July - 12 August (Campers)

The traditional Alpine Meet (that we all know and love) will be held at Pontresina. Situated close to the foot of Val Bernina, Pontresina is the leading mountaineering resort of the Engadine and enjoys spectacular views of the Piz Palu and many neighbouring mountains. INDEX TO LADIES ALPINE CLUB YEARBOOKS 1910 - 1975

Johanna Merz has just completed the Herculean task, never before attempted, of compiling a comprehensive Index to these Yearbooks. It is now being printed in a soft back Alpine Journal format, amounting to 240 pages, in a limited edition of 100, and will be available at the end of February from the Librarian Margaret Ecclestone at the Club in return for a donation to the Library of £10 a copy, plus £2 p&p. It has been compiled in several sections and, in particular, the first section on People provides a remarkable and fascinating concise history of the contribution of British women to Alpine climbing in the period before the LAC merged with the Alpine Club. There is also an Area Index and a section covering the history of the LAC. The Index is an attractive volume in itself as well as an essential adjunct to collections of the Year-books and to members' own mountaineering libraries.
